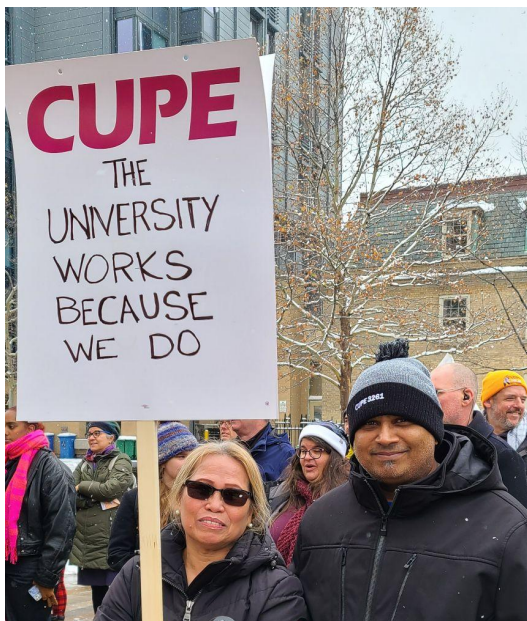


Bargaining Bulletin

DAY OF ACTION FOR GOOD JOBS

CUPE 3902 and CUPE 3261 held a spirited Day of Action for Good Jobs at the St. George campus today with representation from unions as well as student leaders from U of T. CUPE 3902 Unit 3 members (approximately 1100 contract instructors and education workers) could also potentially be on strike for good jobs and job security.

An energetic rally was followed by leafleting and speaking with members of the university community. Speakers included Fred Hahn, president of CUPE Ontario, Maëlis Barre, president of the UTM Student Union, and Fatemah Nami, the president of the Arts & Science Student Union. The movement for good jobs and justice for workers at U of T is only beginning. Together, workers and students can create change that benefits the entire university community.

STRIKE PAY UPDATE

Many members requested top-up to CUPE National Strike Pay. As a result of higher than anticipated financial pledges from various unions and faculty associations in Ontario and beyond, your Executive Committee was able to pass an emergency motion (see below) to top-up strike pay if there is a strike on Monday November 21. Join Saturday's Special Membership Meeting to vote on this motion.

Note: only those who have signed up for picket duty are eligible for strike pay. It is crucial for members to complete the strike pay form at 3261.cupe.ca/strike as soon as possible.
