FT & PT WORKERS ARE TAKING ACTION FOR A FAIR CONTRACT

High participation, unity and solidarity are necessary to win fair contracts. That's why CUPE 3261 has been doing member training to have hundreds of one-on-one conversations with FT and PT workers to build power. Most of you agree that contracting out is a serious threat and have asked your Negotiating Committee to address it in this round of bargaining. We are excited to report that a majority of you have agreed to take action during this round of negotiations to stop contracting out. This is an historic level of participation in our union.

BILL 124 LIMITS COMPENSATION INCREASES TO 1%

Doug Ford's Conservative government has passed legislation (Bill 124) limiting public sector compensation increases to 1% for a 3-year period. This legislation is an attack on free collective bargaining and is being legally challenged by CUPE and other unions. FT & PT workers got the maximum allowable 1% compensation increase from Jul 1, 2020 to Jun 30, 2021. This covered one out of the three-year "moderation period" set out in the legislation. Bill 124 captures compensation broadly and includes wages, benefits, paid leaves, paid sick days, allowances, and more. Your Negotiating Committee will do its best to negotiate the maximum compensation increase possible.
