2024 Executive Election

Elections for the CUPE 3261 Executive are being held this October. In this election, there is one (1) contested position for the executive team, with a total of two (2) candidates participating.

The following positions are up for election:

The election will be conducted electronically over a one week period. Voting will start on Friday, October 11th and end on Friday, October 18th.

To accommodate members who are unable to vote online, electronic voting stations will be set up across our campuses. The voting station locations are listed on page 2.

The election results will be announced the day after the election and the winner will be sworn in during our October General Membership Meeting, scheduled for October 26, 2024. This meeting will be conducted in a hybrid format, allowing members to participate either in person or online.

The position of Health and Safety Officer was previously contested, however, due to the withdrawal of one of the candidates, no election will be held. As a result, the remaining candidate Kevin McDermott will be acclaimed to the position.

Candidate Statements

President

Luke Daccord

I'm proud to be running for re-election as President of CUPE 3261. Over the past year, I've dedicated myself to the renewal of our union. We've fought and won historic victories, and I'm committed to continuing this momentum to create an even stronger union.

Before my election, I worked as a Sport Facility Operator at the Varsity Centre on St. George campus. I joined U of T in 2016 and **since 2017 I've been an active union member**, becoming a shop steward and serving two terms as Recording Secretary. In 2022, I led the Full-Time Part-Time unit's bargaining campaign against contracting out, and in June 2023 I was elected President.

I ran for president because we needed real change to build a powerful and engaged union. Just weeks into my term, we overhauled our bylaws, expanding voting from limited in-person meetings that involved only a handful of members, to a week-long, in-person and electronic voting process. **The result was unprecedented turnout with nearly half of our membership participating.**

Under my leadership in Fall 2023, together we launched a historic bargaining campaign, bringing together 1,000 members across Full-Time, Casual, and 89 Chestnut bargaining units. **We rejected traditional secrecy surrounding negotiations and also organized with fellow CUPE locals 3902 and 1230, building a coalition of 10,000 strong.** This never-before-seen strike threat led to unprecedented gains: a \$25 living wage for full-time workers, paid sick days and a \$20 wage for casuals, decreased benefit costs, and much more. We demonstrated the power we have when workers come together.

Since bargaining, we've been busy defending our agreement and expanding the union's capacity. We've filed a record number of grievances, pushing back against the University's attempts to undermine our hard-won gains.

We've begun electing and training new stewards for the first time in years, and must continue this to effectively enforce our contract. Financial transparency also remains critical, and we've reduced executive costs and improved oversight to ensure every dollar of our dues is used wisely and accounted for.

If re-elected, I will:

- Continue strengthening ties with CUPE 3902 and 1230 – a united CUPE on campus has the power to win the respect and dignity we deserve!
- Continue building the effectiveness and capacity of our union by empowering stewards and executive members
- **Apply lessons from recent bargaining to upcoming campaigns for the U of T Press and Faculty Club units.**
- Ensure every member is informed of their rights by improving outreach and distributing collective agreements
- Lead a renewed fight against contracting out, which has already replaced over 100 of our jobs and threatens many more.
- **Aggressively enforce our contract through grievances and workplace actions.**

Together, we've proven that when we stand united, we win! I'm asking for your vote to help keep building a powerful fighting union that protects us and wins new victories for all.
