The grievance regarding the shift premium for those working 12pm to 8:30pm is expected to be heard by an arbitrator in early January. After many year, we have returned to having Labour Management Meeting. The meeting held on October 22nd, attended by Stewards, President, and National Reps, allowed us to raise our concerns on many issues. They are expected to be held quarterly going forward.

National Convention Report By Pearla Cox

Going into this convention, I did not have any specific expectations. I approached it with an open mind, intending to observe, listen, and learn. What I quickly realized was that many of the delegates shared similar experiences, concerns, and ideas as those in our own workplace.

There was a strong sense of shared purpose among members from different regions and Locals. It became evident that unions are not just formal organizations—they are powerful, collective forces made up of passionate people who care deeply about fairness, representation, and the dignity of work.

One of the most impactful parts of the convention was seeing how amendments and constitutional changes are proposed, debated, and ultimately decided.

National Convention Report (Continued) By Pearla Cox

Understanding how these processes shape the direction of our union gave me a much deeper appreciation for member participation and democratic structure. I also noticed how strongly people felt about the issues being discussed. There were thoughtful and sometimes intense viewpoints expressed on both sides of various resolutions, with particularly active engagement from younger members. Their presence and confidence showed the strength and momentum of the next generation of union leadership.

Throughout the convention, I was supported by my local 3261 delegates, especially Hillary our Chief Steward, who took the time to explain procedures, terminology, and context behind the discussions. Their guidance helped me understand not only what was happening on the floor, but why it mattered. This made the experience not just informative but personally meaningful.

I am returning to our workplace with a stronger understanding of how our union operates and the importance of being engaged in these decision-making processes. I am bringing back a clearer sense of how every member - regardless of role or experience level - has a voice and the ability to influence change. I also gained a renewed appreciation for the value of educating and involving newer members, especially those who may not yet see themselves leaders. Encouraging as participation, sharing knowledge. and keeping communication open are key to strengthening our Local.

Most importantly, I am bringing back the belief that the union is not something separate from us - we are the union. The power of our collective voice is real, and when we show up and take part, we shape the conditions we work under and the future we want to see.

UofT Press Tentative Agreement Ratified

We are excited to announce that, following four ratification meetings last month, all three bargaining units have ratified the tentative agreements with 100% in favour.

As of 12:01AM, Friday, November 7th, the agreements came into effect.

They contain a common expiry date, for the first time in over 25 years, solidifying the power of all CUPE 3261 workers at UTP to bargain together for the future, as well as paths to Full-Time employment for Part-Time Warehouse employees, an average of 3% yearly wage increases for all, improvements to PT sick leave and much much more!

The union will be updating the collective agreement copies ASAP. Now the work of enforcing all these improvements is our task.
